Total Care Services Continues to Move Forward

Total Care Services, Inc. has continued to move forward in its growth and services for people diagnosed with Intellectual and/or Developmental Disabilities. Our successes have been anchored in the leadership of the organization and the strong commitment of our staff.

District of Columbia Programs

In January 2019, Total Care Services, Inc. received its Annual Provider Certification licenses from the D.C. Department of Disability Services, Development Disabilities Administration. This is the ninth straight year that TCS has received the approval of the District to provide services to District residents. The PCR team certified the following services: Supportive Living; Respite Services; In-Home Support; Day Habilitation; Individualized Day Supported Employment.

The DC Programs added a new service. In March 2019, the District authorized TCS to provide the newly created Parent Support Services. Parent support services assist people who are or will be parents in developing appropriate parenting skills.

Parents receive training that is individualized and focused on the health, welfare and developmental needs of their child, as well as, building necessary parenting skills.

Maryland Coordination of Community Services Program

On March 7, 2019, our Maryland Coordination of Community Services program was reauthorized to provide Targeted Case Management services for individuals supported by the Developmental Disabilities Administration. We will continue to provide coordination of services to individuals in the Central and Southern regions of Maryland.

In the fall of 2018, Gloria Odongo, MS, assumed leadership of the CCS program. Her energy and expertise were vital as the CCS program under took a successful restructuring initiative, intensified its training regimen, and expanded its collaboration with community partners. Key initiatives included enhancement of the Quality Assurance program and tool kit; establishment of intensive week long new hire orientation training; and expanded community collaborations and training.




Since September 2018, we have had the opportunity to help- out as Social Work Interns at the Maryland Coordination of Community Services program.

Transitioning Youth Season Wrapping-Up

Since joining Total Care Services, Inc. in September 2018, we had opportunities to work closely with the Transitioning Youth team. We helped prepare the staff to represent TCS at TY fairs throughout Maryland as they provided individuals and families with important information about adult services. The Transitioning Youth staff not only coordinated services on behalf of their assigned individuals, but also provided information and guidance to individuals and families who were completing high school and entering the world of adult services. We helped the staff research information on the LTSS, prepared informational folders, inventoried case files and attend

During the course of the year, the TY unit and its CCS partners held two TCS Transitioning Youth events. The first was held at the BECO Conference Center in Lanham, where twelve other providers met with individuals and their families to talk about services available to meet the needs of the individuals. This event was a great success both for the individuals and their families and also for the providers. In January 2019, TCS partnered with NCIA to hold a second TY event at the Baltimore campus of NCIA. Again, TCS was able to build relationships with other community and Maryland Developmental Disabilities Administration providers.
